


Parent Access Tip

Below is an example of what a parent sees in the Parent Access portion of Progress Book. If grades are not posted to the Parent Access side, but entered on the teacher's side of Progress Book, the average from the teacher's side is what is displayed as the overall average. This causes a great deal of confusion. I would suggest that whenever a grade is entered into Progress Book, teachers do one of two things. When entering grades on the teacher side, also make sure to select the "Post to Web" box so that parents can see the grades. Or, don't enter any grades into Progress Book until you are ready for parents to see those grades.

When these are added together, the points earned by this child equals 165 out of a possible 178. That is the equivalent of .926 or 93%.

*Note the average of 88.75.

All grades must be posted to the web in order for parents to get a clear and accurate picture of what is really going on with their child's grades. Not posting grades for parents to see only promotes more confusion for the parents and students.
