

No Child Left Behind: Public School Choice (PSC) and Supplemental Educational Services (SES)

Final regulations for No Child Left Behind were released on October 28, 2008. Included in these final regulations are directives for strengthening Public School Choice (PSC) and Supplemental Education Services (SES). The final regulations require School Districts ensure that parents have access to timely, clear, and easily accessible information on their PSC and SES options in the following manner:

Willard City Schools is now required to include on this website the following information:

*District maximum allowable allocation for PSC: \$34,500.00
